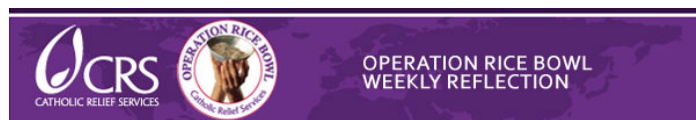
Topics to be discussed at the next meeting will include:

Second Week of Lent: Coming Down From the Mountaintop
Bolivia, located in central South America just west of Brazil, is about three times the size of Montana. CRS helped the Velasquez family learn new agricultural techniques after they moved from their poorly producing mountain village to a warmer location. Mountains are the Bible's prime real estate for encounters with God. Moses, Elijah, Jesus—all met God on mountaintops.

In your prayer this week, ask God where you are being sent. Who awaits you at the foot of your mountain? How are you being challenged to listen to Jesus this week, as you follow him to the cross?

Fast

As you plan your week, make some time to pray as the prophets did. Set aside everything—time, physical comfort, food—to listen carefully to what God is saying to you. You might consider skipping a meal and spending the time by yourself in prayer. While a mountaintop might not be handy, a chapel, winter path or bedroom might be the place to escape distractions.

Give

In Bolivia, 40 percent of the population works in agriculture. This week, place 40 cents a day in your Rice Bowl in solidarity with the Bolivians who earn their living from the land, and in turn, seek to steward it.

Are You a Registered Parishioner? “I’ve attended this church for years.” But, have you registered? If you were registered under your parent’s name but are now an adult on your own, you also need to register. You must be a registered parishioner to be married in the Church, have your child baptized, or to be a Baptism or Confirmation Sponsor. Contact the Parish Office for further information.

ST. JOHN CHURCH PARISH POLICIES

BAPTISMS: Baptisms are generally not ministered during the Lenten Season. Parents planning to have their baby baptized must receive instruction prior to Baptism. The next instruction *Class will be held on, March 21, 2010 at 7:00 p.m.* Please meet in the Church. You must first register with Fr. Raymond (635-5590).

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES: A person wishing to be a sponsor for the Sacraments of Baptism or Confirmation must be a registered member in good standing with our Church.

MARRIAGE: Arrangements for weddings need to be made in person by the parties of the proposed marriage at least one year in advance and prior to setting any date. **PLEASE TAKE NOTE: Norms for Marriage in the Diocese of Norwich require that those planning marriages should contact the priest one year prior to the marriage.**

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING is given to those who are seriously ill or about to undergo surgery. Please call the parish office, 635-5590.

COMMUNION TO THOSE WHO ARE HOMEBOUND: Special ministers of the Eucharist may bring Communion to the home of those who are homebound. The priests will visit once a month.
